



CP-64 One Step Disinfectant

Guidelines regarding CORONAVIRUS

NOTE: The US Center for Disease Control's 2019-nCoV information page recommends that people clean all frequently touched surfaces every day, as well as any surfaces that may have blood, body fluids and/or secretions or excretions on them. They suggest the use of a diluted bleach solution or a household disinfectant with label claims against human coronaviruses.

CP-64 is an EPA approved disinfectant able to kill coronaviruses.

Do's and Don'ts When Protecting Yourself Against Coronavirus

Cover your coughs and sneezes

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw used tissues in a lined trash can; immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Soap and water should be used preferentially if hands are visibly dirty.

WASH YOUR HANDS frequently

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains 60 to 95% alcohol, covering all surfaces of your hands and rubbing them together until they feel dry. Soap and water should be used preferentially if hands are visibly dirty. **Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.**

Clean and disinfect all "touch point" surfaces everyday

CP-64 One- Step Disinfectant

Remove heavy soil deposits from surface, then thoroughly wet surface with the use-solution. The use-solution can be applied with a cloth, mop, sponge, or coarse spray or by soaking. For sprayer applications, use a coarse spray device. Spray 6 - 8 inches from the surface, rub with a brush, cloth or sponge. Do not breathe spray. Let solution remain on surface for a minimum of 10 minutes. Rinse or allow to air dry.
